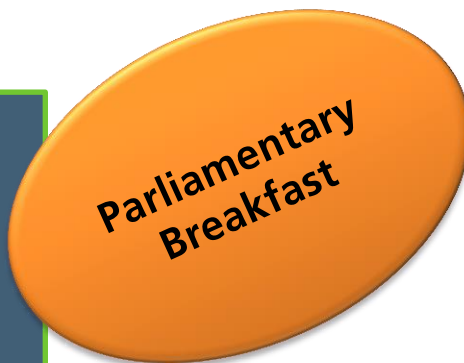

Energetic modernisation of the professionally managed building stock has a long history throughout Europe. But the criteria of cost-efficiency and proportionality show the limits of the current strategy for reaching our climate targets. The focus on the building envelope can lead to increasing costs for tenants in many European countries, despite lower energy bills. Instead of ever increasing burdening and driving of costs for buildings, the decarbonisation of energy supply seems a valid alternative.

The current revision of the EPBD offers a great opportunity to strengthen the contribution of the building sector to climate protection. Along with the energy efficiency of buildings, the climate-friendly supply of buildings with renewable energies can be an important contributing factor in moving towards this end. This is especially true for Member States which have already energetically refurbished a majority of their building stock.

We would like to discuss the introduction of indicators for CO₂ emissions and final energy use with you. Could this be the way forward?
