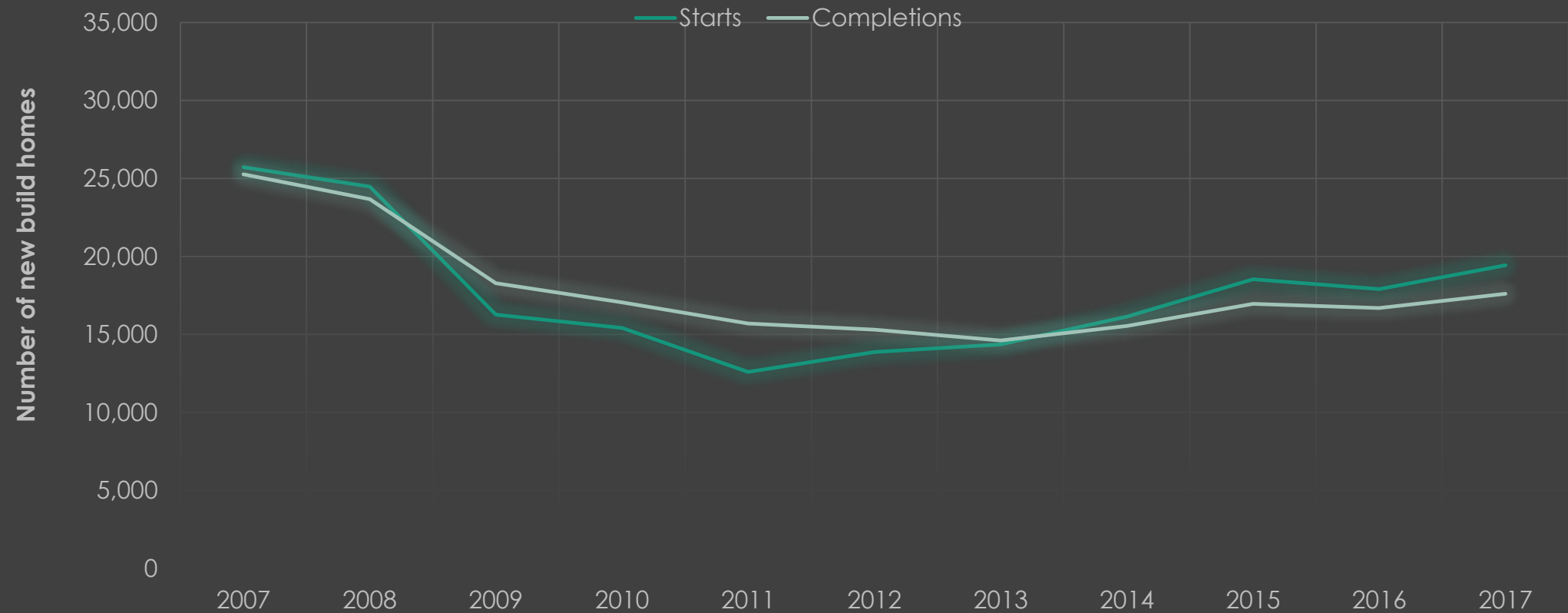

Information to define needs?

- ▶ **The whole population, regularly, with clear and sound method, using reliable data bringing together national projections and local insight and data held locally in organisations.**

Who should lead evidence collection?

- ▶ **The municipality or local authority should lead the local data collection and feed the national picture, supported by academics and practitioners in the field – a process of engagement.**

How to go from evidence to policy formulation?

- ▶ **Engagement of practitioners, prospective beneficiaries, lobbyists at the local and national level with politicians and decision makers at national and local levels.**
